



COMPETITION SECRETARY REPORT FOR FEBRUARY

With the 20th Anniversary Weekend almost upon us, I am sure that those members who are planning to attend are looking forward to the trip and, if entering, the Mudgee Trial. As of writing I understand that the Saturday rally has approx. 45 entrants - should be a good day for all concerned.

There will no doubt be full accounts of the weekend activities in the March magazine. I am unfortunately unable to attend but wish all participants a great and safe weekend promoting the CRC.

The status of upcoming Events is as follows:

CLARENCE CLASSIC - SAT 29th/SUN30th MARCH.

The second of the Club's competition rallies will be run out of Grafton on the dates indicated above. Because of the need to organise things like meals, accommodation, windscreen banners, clothing etc it should be noted that your entry needs to be with Ian and Wendy Gibbs by the 3RD MARCH 2014!! It is suggested that if you plan to enter this Event you should get your paperwork off to Ian before the Mudgee Weekend. Any later and it may be too late! The Supp Regs and Entry Form are available for downloading of the CRC website.

THE AUTUMN CHALLENGE - SAT 26th APRIL.

Planning for this Event is now well underway. You will find details elsewhere in the magazine and Event documents are also on the website.

As well as the usual 3 categories of navigation competition a Social Run will also be included. This will be non-competitive, will use the Tour Instructions and will be run under a separate CAMS Social Event Permit. Participants in this category will NOT be required to hold a CAMS Competition Licence. We hope this might encourage those members who do not want to be involved in the 3

competitive categories to enter and give their classic car a run in the company of other CRC members. Give it a shot.

BARRY FERGUSON CLASSIC - SAT 31st MAY/SUN 1st JUNE.

Work on this rally by the Event team is on-going. A route check is planned for mid-March, to allow the Instructions to be checked and, if necessary, amended to suit actual road layouts etc. The Apprentice and Tour categories will be run predominantly on sealed roads with, it is anticipated, about 22-23kms of unsealed sections. This total is not considered to be too excessive on a 2 day rally and the condition of any unsealed roads will be assessed during the route check. The Challenge category (Masters) will involve a larger use of unsealed roads and require navigating possibly from older maps. Those who have competed previously in this category will know what to expect from Dave Johnson!!

ALPINE CLASSIC - SAT 18th/SUN 19th OCTOBER PAS DE DEUX - mid NOVEMBER

HISTORY OF THE CLASSIC RALLY CLUB INC.

Introduction by John Cooper, Club Historian.

It gives me much pleasure to present the following information in respect of our Club's history for "The 20" magazine edition. This information has never previously been collated and is based on research from our newsletters and meeting minutes. Unfortunately some information was never recorded and as such, some additional research would be necessary to detail our history a little more comprehensively. You may notice no record at all for the 1996 CRC Championship point score, this is because it cannot be found anywhere, and in 1997 names were produced with information taken from members' trophies. If you can help me to fill in these gaps or any other missing data from our first 20 years, please let me know so I can complete our records.

I will attempt to update our records yearly because this is an important aspect of our Club's history and it should not go unrecorded.

1994 January 25th. Foundation Meeting -

Strathfield West Bowling Club.

Geoff Bott calls for interested rally participants to attend a special meeting to discuss the proposal of forming a Classic Rally Club/Association to mainly have a force or voice with CAMS who were developing the new rally codes, that would affect our sport, and be an organisation that would advance and develop the cause of Classic Rallying as well as conduct rallies for classic and historic cars. 65 people attended, and voted to form a club for Classic Rallies and elected a steering Committee to get things underway. Twenty people joined and paid their subs on the night and many more were to would withdraw from his previously elected follow.

The CRC convinced the Jaguar Mountain Rally organisers to include the Mini Mountain Rally in their event. This provided the opportunity to compete for two days on equal terms with the six day competitors and gave teams without available time, plus newcomers to the sport, the opportunity to be involved.

By August the Club boasted 66 financial members. In September Magazine Club Editor, Geoff Bott, relocated his business to Melbourne to take up his position as General Manager of VIGIL Insurances for VGL Insurance Brokers, and resigned as Editor.

Due to costs at Crows Nest our meeting venue was relocated to Parramatta Rugby Union Club for the start of 1996. The AGM was held on the 27th February and the Committee was unchanged and decided to move the AGM from February to November each year, to allow the Committee to function for the full rally year's calendar.

The Classic Rally Club organised and conducted its first official rally event. A one day rally called the R.L Nicholson Rally, with sponsorship from club member Ken Convoy through his shipping customs business. The rally was directed and organised by Jocelyn Vettoretti. She was assisted by John Vickery. 32 Cars entered and competed on the 19th May. In June a competition for a club logo was notified with entries to be forwarded for consideration. In July the membership of the Club was at 76. Tony Kanak was elected at the September meeting to be the Classic Rally Club's CAMS delegate.

The CRC investigated the possibility of having a Club Plate Registration Scheme, and would need 5 cars to kick things off. Expressions of interest were sought.

Difficulties in producing a Club newsletter were continuing – the Club bought it's first computer and publishing software for \$500, however due to various reasons including computer malfunctions, Editor illness and other issues, no newsletters were produced.

No Rally Directions Newsletters were produced for most of the year until Geoff Bott, from Melbourne, published the 1996 Year Book in November. The November Meeting was the Annual General Meeting and a lot of the existing Committee Members retired and a new era of the Club commenced.

Geoff Bott returned to Sydney and took up the role of Editor once again to boost communication for the Club.

In April a new meeting place/venue was discussed due to continuing issues at Parramatta Rugby Club and in August the Club moved to it's new home at the MG Car Club's rooms at Henley Bowling Club. New rallies appeared, Jeff West conducted the first "Riverina Run" using the Wagga Car Club. Jeff Whitton invited CRC to the Forest Classic Rally in Wangaratta Victoria, run by Rally Sport News and the first short lived East Coast Targa was contested. The Classic Rally Club backed the Club's major rally of the year, "The Vigil Alpine Marathon Rally" with Rally Director Adrian Carrick, Clerk of Course John Henderson and Administration Director Lui MacLennan. The Rally was run in October.

In June, Lui MacLennan took on the job of establishing the Club's plate registration scheme. She sought and obtained approval from the R.T.A for the Club to commence its own club plate rego commencing in January 2000.

Club Incorporation was finalised and the Club took on the new name of Classic Rally Club Inc.

Ted took the nickname of Ted-itor. In May the CRC was affiliated with the Council of Veteran Vintage and Thoroughbred Motor Clubs Incorporated (CVVTMC), later to be renamed Council of Motor Clubs (CMC), and the Club attended their first Display Day at Eastern Creek.

The CRC Club Plate scheme, through the RTA, commenced with blue and yellow Classic Rally Club number plates.

Brian Cooper was honoured with Life Membership, for services to the Classic Rally Club.

In May President Brian Cooper passeed away. His position was left vacant until the November AGM meeting, where Lui MacLennan was elected to the position of CRC President.

The late Brian Cooper will be well remembered for directing many of the Classic Rally Club's rallies, and for the contribution he made to promote and steer the Classic Rally Club to the level we all enjoyed and participated in using our classic cars for such events. August saw the running of our first annual driver training/track day at Wakefield Park Motor Circuit. The CRC organised a rally in November in honour of our past President. This was called "Coops Last Run". The "gurus" of classic rallying decided to bond together and set a fun run type event in Brian's name. Many Directors and Clerks of Course were involved in organising the event to raise funds for the Nepean Hospital Intensive Care Unit. It was decided that the event be all daylight and would be divided into 3 classes - The Challenge, with tricky grid reference navigation, The Tour, all route chartered and The Social, which used mainly main roads but loosely followed the same route as the other two classes but in the opposite direction. The event started and finished at Wilton, near Picton and the lunch break was at Berry on the South Coast where the two navigation groups and the Social group crossed over. The route was cunningly devised so that this point was half way and everyone arrived somewhere near the same time slot.

Broadly, the navigation groups headed to the coast via Mt Keira Road then through Kembla Grange to Dapto, across the Huntley and Marshal Mount to an interesting water crossing. We then travelled via Jamberoo Mountain, Saddleback Mountain, Kiama, Gerringong, Toulijooa and Coolangatta to Berry. After lunch we visited Kangaroo Valley, Fitzroy Falls, Bowral, Mittagong, Buxton, Thirlmere, Picton and back to Wilton for afternoon tea. Magically, all competitors arrived back within reasonable time of one another. The Social Group did all of the above in reverse order.

Almost every marque car was represented. It was a great showcase of sports and classic cars with a few modern cars thrown in to the 86 car field. The oldest car was a 1934 super charged MG PA. A large number of the Club's "heavies" were organising the event but this didn't stop four crews from clean-sheeting the challenge, while 22 crew cleaned the Tour – maybe the event was a tad too

easy, but none the less, great fun!
So what was the point of it all? Well, one was to gather the group of motor sport friends and collectively have fun in our old cars while remembering, possibly for the last time as a group, our good friend Brian. Secondly, we saw along the route some of the best scenery NSW has to offer. Thirdly, we raised over \$8,500 on the event, which when added to the money raised at events run by Classic Rally, MG, Thornleigh, Jaguar Clubs, plus many personal donations took the total given to Nepean Hospital ICU to in excess of \$27,000 – a fitting tribute to Brian Cooper.

Some Words from our Founder, by Geoff Bott.

The Classic Rally Club. Like many thousands of car enthusiasts in the 1960s and 1970s I was smitten with rallying and competed in the South Australian Rally Championship. Family commitments meant that this unpromising career was shelved but the love of the sport lay dormant within me.

In the 1980s I established the Historicar bookshop and became the largest retailer in Australia of the Duke Marketing range of VHS videos. I was entranced by a particular video from the 1970s called the "Avon Tour of Britain" that was designed to test the skills of circuit racers versus rally drivers. It linked a series of British race circuits by navigational & forest stages thus providing a good test to determine the best drivers of the day. Rally drivers generally won as they had the best combination of skills.

Then in 1989 came the Pirelli Marathon in Europe and I devoured the exploits of my rally heroes such as Roger Clark, Paddy Hopkirk, Stirling Moss and many others and desperately wanted to run in this type of event which also combined navigational challenges, hillclimbs and circuit sprints. I put together a proposal for such an event to be run here in NSW and put it to the Jaguar Drivers Club of Australia, of which I was a member (but lacking ownership of a Jaguar at the time).

The JDCA enthusiastically embraced the concept as they were looking for an idea to reinvigorate the club at the time, having had a perilous time financially in the recent past. The event that resulted was the 1991 Repco Mountain Rally and it attracted a field of 110 entries drawn from every state in Australia. It was very successful as it was the first event of its kind, ran for 6 days and had 2 full days of competition and 4 days of navigational stages, all timed.

However, despite the success of the event I felt that a marque car club was not going to be devoted to the concept wholeheartedly and was eventually going to run out of steam, as although the organising committee was very enthusiastic, it was drawing from a very small group of dedicated people within that club. In 1994 I called a meeting of interested parties largely drawn from competitors of the Repco Mountain Rally with the idea of forming a club that was specifically designed to support navigational rallies for classic cars. Over 60 people turned up and the Classic Rally Club was formed. I was the inaugural president and with a small committee then took up the challenge of getting representation at CAMS, forming a constitution and the multitude of tasks required to get a club running.

Meetings were well attended and the club slowly grew. Our first Editor of "Rally Directions" was Paul van der Heyden but he left to return the USA and I ceded the Presidency to John Vickery and took up the Editor's post. Other founding members included Adrian Walmsley, Tony Kanak, Brian and John Cooper and Garth Taylor to name a few.

Adrian was the Treasurer for many years. "The Joke" was the main part of his presentation at meetings and set the tone for the night with many convivial discussions. This is one of the reasons that the CRC has never developed an attitude where it took itself too seriously at meetings and avoided politicking. Tony Kanak has been a steady force in the club for its entire existence as Secretary.

One of the first things we arranged was a club championship, combining the current events that soon came about.

A nomination from the membership and subsequent vote elected our then president Brian Cooper to Life Membership status for his continued advancement of, and services to the CRC. Brian was presented with his badge not long before he passed away in May 2004.

Note: Club member Margaret Brown was awarded the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) in the 1997 Australia Day Honours for services to Motor Sport, and the Canberra Youth Theatre.



The usual three categories of instructions, Masters, Apprentice and Tour will be available for those wanting to take part in the C.R.C.


