

Record of the Classic Rally Club Inc-Annual General Meeting held at Denistone Sports Club at 8pm on 24/11/2014.

The AGM was opened at 8.03 pm by President John cooper. The attendance book was circulated for noting of those in attendance and apologies.

- Moved by Tony Wise, 2^{nded} Garth Taylor to adopt the record of the 2014 AGM, as previously printed in the club magazine. No matters arising, the motion was carried.
- A report from the President had been printed in the most recent issue of the club magazine Rally Directions covering the year in review.
- The secretary provided a brief report confirming that the club was not facing any legal action or insurance claims and that relationships with CAMS and the CMC were going smoothly.
- The Treasurer provided a report especially discussing the trading loss of \$4423 for the period to 30/6/15 which had been primarily influenced by low returns from events as surpluses (as per club policy to keep event fees as low as possible) and from the escalating costs for the magazine production. Plans to remedy the shortfall will be a priority for the 2016 C'tee. The Treasurer noted and the President elaborated that as one step in the club budget and financial plan, the 2015 Christmas/end of year function expenses will be markedly reduced from the previous year.
- The Membership Secretary reported that 395 members were on strength and that 145 magazines were typically produced to cover the club's needs, the disparity in the number of magazines being a reflection of family memberships and preference for magazines in electronic form.
- HCRS report from Ron Cooper advised that 50 vehicles were currently on the scheme and that the first take-up by members of the new 60 day scheme option from the NSW RMS had now taken place. It was also directed that the meeting note that members switching their HCRS vehicles to the 60 day option MUST advise the HCRS Coordinator.
- Magazine editor as noted Rally Directions and repeated by the President, Jen Navin has kindly agreed to transition into the editor's role with a handover from Bob Morey. The meeting thanked Bob Morey for his fine work over an extended period of time.
- Competition Secretary Tony Norman thanked al officials, volunteers and competitors who were active in the 2015 year and that the point score results showed the extent of the participation in another successful year of club activity.
- Moved by Garth Taylor, 2^{nded} by Ross Warner to accept, these reports, carried.
- In the absence of any special business the election of the office bearers for 2016 was conducted by Tony Wise. The retiring c'tee stood down for the election.
- Election of office bearers for 2015 conducted by long term member Tony Wise who took the chair as returning officer for the proceedings of the election which confirmed uncontested nominations for the three elected positions.

The 2016 c'tee thanked Tony Wise for his conduct of the election process then proceeded to fill the other positions mostly unchanged from 2015 and from responses to the request previously printed in Rally Directions for people to come forward with new offers of assistance with the

2016 Wollondilly 270

This event is a Touring Assembly, to be held between the Penrith and Southern Highlands regions on 28th February 2016.

The Entry Form is included in this Rally Directions magazine.

A Guide to the Event will be circulated to all entrants by late January.

The event will be run under the NSW Touring Code (Provisional), refer below for more details.

The course has been set with the following aims:

To provide Masters and Apprentices crews with challenging navigation using old 1950/60s maps. Have the start and finish very close to Sydney to minimise long journeys for the majority of crews. Travel over some seldom used roads that most drivers will enjoy.

The length has been shortened to 270 km. Crews should have heaps of time

To use roads over some hills and mountains with extensive views

Only use suburban roads when necessary and/or to pose navigational challenges

The population has increased greatly in the last 40 years in this region. However the course is mostly on roads that are of a rural character and do not have heavy traffic

We are unable to match the Alpine Classic with only 2 sets of Traffic Lights. The bad news is there are more than 14 when heading south from the Cranebrook start towards Wollondilly Shire. The good news is there are only 3 more in Division 1 and only one set in Division 2

Touring Code Update


There are 19 NSW specific Clauses, which have been moved to Appendix C, NSW Standard Touring Bulletin 1





CRC FEBRUARY MEETING Special Guest Speaker
