What will the first event for next year in February be called?

Or musings by Martin Leaver

My introduction to these events was the Tour d'Course, and then from other events I saw quite a few were variations of famous events, while Tony Norman came up with new names for each of his events. Having run the Buckett List Tour in 2020 through the Hunter and Central Coast, I was thinking of running an event around the Tumut area, similar to the 2017 Alpine Classic. Tumut Tumbarumba was one example of TT, which made me think of the Isle of Mann TT, and then following the Tour d'Course style pun names, the Ire of Man popped into my head. So the Ire of Man Tablelands Tour was one working title.

Back to the Buckett List Tour, I had thought of the Goldfish Rally, as while we were doing set up, Robbie kept asking me "what are we doing next?" This is particularly relevant were the good roads are quite long and there's no point making the drive worse for the sake of a navigation exercise.

When I learned that Mal's Cootamundra Trial would be running in March, I decided to switch my event to a run down to the far South Coast from Canberra, so the City to Surf became a possible name. My four main event maps are named after towns starting with the letter C, so the 4C rally (an Alfa reference) is another idea. I'm still to submit my supplementary regulations to Motorsport Australia, and the title is still to be finalised, but the Ire of Man is currently winning.

So what will the event be?

Firstly, I'm looking at a social event in central Canberra on the Friday night. Generally the navigation should be pretty obvious as there are fewer road choices, but over two days, we should get a unique winner. Much of the distance has a 100 km/h limit, so any questions on those roads will be easy to spot if you are on the right road and looking in the right place.

The overnight stop will be in the Merimbula, but I have some arrangements to confirm there. The total distance will be approximately 800 km, but given the simplicity of the navigation and the speed of the roads, I believe this will be relatively comfortable.

With the BLT, I had a few questions for Masters and Apprentices that involved plotting the location of the question or calculating something based on a distance sign. For this event, the Tour category will be fully route-charted, but the crews will get maps and there will be a few instances where knowing where you are will be helpful if you want to win. If you just want to enjoy some great roads, you can just follow the route chart.

The Tour category will have approximately 5 km of dirt. The final total for the Masters and Apprentices will depend on whether some other roads get graded over the summer to remove the potholes. Whether I change the instructions or put in a Z board will depend. While there will be Z boards, road realignments won't be a significant test for the event as I don't want to put the effort in to check everything involved in ensuring I have all the alignments correct.

There may be a social category with mapped navigation using the Apprentice instructions, but this is yet to be confirmed. Tony Norman mentioned this might interest some people who don't have competition licences.

If I do use the Ire of Man title, I'm not expecting the difficulty of the event to cause any busted marriages. There will be a little thinking required, but it should mostly be an enjoyable drive on roads the club hasn't used in my time in club.

The most recent Alpine Classic, of 19-20 November, continuing the fame of this now legendary event had to deal with the effects of recent major floods-which perhaps demonstrates that rally enthusiasts are at least as hardy a group as the post office was once supposed to be....

Special thanks are also due to Glenn Evans who smoothly manages membership records and processes for the Club, as well as being the email message wrangler(?) and to Chris Mc Donald who keeps getting the eagerly awaited issues of Rally Directions out on time.

It is also appropriate to recognise the enthusiasm and contributions of the folks who oversee the actual competition processes and scoring, Ross Warner and Mike Batten. Last but not least the continued calm focus of our Treasurer and the energy and enthusiasm of our long-term President also merit mention of course. I apologise if I had inadvertently left any deserving people out of this acknowledgement- but I'm recovering from five days at the Sandown Historic races as I produce this report.

During the past year the monthly meetings at the Strathfield Golf Club have featured a number of special guests who have enlivened the normal meeting format with tales from rally history or other derring-do involving classic vehicles.

With respect to the financial situation the Treasurer's Report will provide more illumination, but I can

report that the Club has no current issues with bad debts, or insurance claims, or legal action, and is in a sound position for the next year.

The relationships with Motorsport Australia (formerly CAMS) CAMS and the Council of Motor Clubs are both working well, and the CRC was again well-represented at the major CMC event in august at Sydney MotorSport Park, returning after two years of Covid hiatus. The issue of latitude with permissible vehicle modifications and eligibility for the HCRS also received further attention during the past year, and currently the CRC's fleet of concessionally registered vehicles numbers over seventy.

Last but not least, the CRC looks forward to continued support from its members during the next twelve months and hopefully people can back to the having the time, energy and budget to enjoy classic rallying activities- after the effects of the Covid restrictions fade into the past, and even if petrol is somewhat dearer than we would like. Spreading even a few dollars around the state's regional areas has some worthwhile benefits for the giver and receiver.



CRC Treasurer's AGM Report

Despite losing the first half of the financial year to lockdowns, and only having events in 2022, the club's finances improved over the 2022 financial year. This was due to the strong support from our members in renewing their membership, supporting the HVP scheme as well as participating in the events we were able to run.

The surplus, after our administration expenses, is however overstated as it included, as at 30th June 2022, entry fees for the Southern Cross rally that was postponed. Since the 30th June much of the \$3,000 paid in entry fees has either been refunded or put towards the entry fees for other rallies.

The club also received a \$1,000 Covid grant from Motorsport Australia so without this, and the Southern Cross entry fees, it was basically a break even year.

Thank-you to all our members for their support in 2022 as we look forward to, hopefully, a full calendar of events in 2022. Best wishes for Christmas and all the best for 2023.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY'S 2022 ANNUAL REPORT

The Club currently has 359 members. This is an increase of seven over 2021. The membership is comprised of:

- 5 Life members;
- 5 Honorary members;
- 279 Family members, including 8 Juniors; and
- 70 Individual members.

The recent Perth to Sydney Marathon 2022 required that all participants (crew, service crew and officials) be members of a club affiliated with Motorsport Australia, so that they would be covered by MA's insurance during the event. Single Event membership of the CRC was offered, for a reduced fee, for participants who were not members of a club affiliated with MA. 40 participants took up Single Event membership, and another five took out full membership. The Single Event members are not included in the Club's 359 members.

Four current members passed away since last year's annual report: Paulina Doyle, John Bryson, Bob Williams and Gordon Lennox. We express our condolences to their loved ones.

The Club gained 34 members since the 2021 AGM. Nine lapsed members, six memberships, rejoined. Two members were added to existing Family memberships. 23 members (five Individual and 18 Family) joined in 11 new memberships.

23 members did not renew in 2022.

There is concern in the Club about falling membership numbers and the difficulty of attracting new members. John Cooper and others remember that the Club used to have a membership in the mid-400s, compared to 359 now.

The membership database records when a member

first joined and when they last left. It previously did not record when members lapsed then rejoined; we have a number of such members each year. The files retained by the Club contain only one or two full membership listings before 2014, and do not include any annual membership reports prior to 2015. They mainly comprise renewal forms, applications for new memberships and membership payments deposited to the bank account.

New Members who Joined, by Year

The Access database came into use in 2001 and the Dates Joined before 2002 are unreliable, so I can't tell how the numbers grew in the Club's first eight years.

From 2002 to 2010, the Club gained about 60 to 80 new members each year. From 2011 to 2015, the Club tended to gain about 40 new members annually. From 2016 to 2019, this dropped to about 30.

Since the onset of COVID (2020 to 2022), we have gained nine, 17 and 25 new members. All these remain members.

Of the 875 members who joined from 1994 to the end of 2010, 200 are still members. Of the 309 who first joined from 2011 to 2019, 110 are still members.

Membership Numbers

I have estimated the membership numbers back to 2008 by counting the renewals and new members. The Club appears to have reached a high of 440 members in 2010 but fell to 353 in 2012. I have yet to determine whether these decreases are correct or whether some renewals are not in the files.

Even though the accuracy of the numbers is doubtful, what I can tell is that the Club turned over as many, or more, members as it gained back then. Certainly, the membership did not grow by 60 to 80 per year. Quite a few of each year's new members remained in the Club for three years or less.

I have held the position of Membership Secretary for the past eight years. In six of those years, the membership has varied by seven, or less, each year; mostly small increases. In two years, however, the Club lost a large number of members: 29 in 2018 and 25 in 2020. The 2020 decrease probably can be attributed to the COVID situation. In 2018, 18 members who joined in 2017 did not renew. Additionally, several Family memberships were changed to Individual, with the loss of 15 Family members (who appeared not to participate in Club activities anyway). There was no obvious reason that all those losses occurred in the one year.

The Flightless Club

I read the Club's constitution and then realized I did fit the entry criteria, so I decided to join...

Changing Interests?

Over the past ten years, the number of new members gained by the CRC each year has fallen by 50 per cent, or more. This probably reflects declining community interest in classic cars and using maps to navigate. It may also reflect that people are less inclined to join physical special interest clubs. I do not know whether other car clubs have experienced the same trends.

I have been a member of the Porsche Club of NSW for many years. In about 2016, the PCNSW President became aware that I had become the Membership Secretary of the CRC, and asked me about our retention of members. The PCNSW then had a membership of some 1100, as I recall. The President's concern was that the Club turned over about 20 per cent of its membership every year! I also recall the presentation of a memento to a new member in about 1997, when the PCNSW membership reached 356! (This is the model

number of the original production Porsche, for those of you not familiar with Porsches.) So, it seems, the PCNSW also experienced significant growth, and significant turnover of members, in the 2000s, similar to that experienced by the CRC.

What these changing numbers mean for the future of the CRC, I cannot tell. I look forward to seeing how well the Club's events are supported as we become less concerned about COVID.

AUTUMN LEAVES GLORY TOUR OF NORTH EAST VICTORIA

JUST FOR FUN

5-7 MAY 2023

Snooks Motorsport will conduct the Autumn Glory Tour of North East Victoria as a three-day Touring & Navigation Assembly for all makes and models of cars of all years that are registered for use on public roads. It is open to anyone who would like to participate, without the need for vehicle eligibility and personal safety equipment which are normally needed for motorsport events and will be conducted under the auspices of Motorsport Australia (MSA).

It is intended to be an annual event on the first weekend of May, to celebrate the glory of the autumn leaves which showcase the region at its colourful best.

The event will contain several categories:

- Social a tour with participants following a prescribed route taking in tourism sights.
- · Tour an observation test (answering questions on local sightings), with prizes for best results; and
- Navigational Challenge using maps for the more rally-minded participants, also with prizes.

The event will be based at the Albury Manor House with dinners planned there for Thursday's night welcome and Sunday night's presentation. The following is a summary of the planned itinerary:

- > Friday's loop from Albury will incorporate Mount Beauty, Bright, Beechworth and Yackandandah
- Saturday's loop will feature breakfast in Tallangatta and then lunch at Walwa, travel via Tumbarumba in NSW and then along the Great River Road to Granya and finally to Tallangatta where the participants will take in dinner organised by the local council, before returning to Albury overnight
- On Sunday the drive will be along the full length of the Great River Road from Bellbridge to Tintaldra and then to Indi (at Biggara- the closest location to the source of the Murray River using bitumen roads). After lunch and a festival at Corryong, the event will head westwards following the Murray Valley Highway to Old Tallangatta and then via Bethanga to the finish in Albury where a presentation function will be conducted.

The Towong Shire Council is fully supporting the event and planning to use it as a catalyst and centerpiece for local community festivals with a Saturday breakfast at Tallangatta (and a dinner that night) plus lunches at Walwa (Saturday) and Corryong (Sunday). Numerous community activities and fund-raising events will be planned around the arrival of the cars. One of their key objectives is to promote the Murray River Road as the Great River Road as a tourist attraction, along same lines as the Great Ocean Road and Great Alpine Road in other regions of Victoria.

Participation for the event will be available on a one day, two days or three days basis, with entry fees in the range of:


- One day \$150

The scheme is designed to allow historic vehicles (more than 30 years old) to be registered under conditional registration which provides limited usage of the vehicle and also provides Compulsory Third Party insurance cover both at a very reduced cost. The Classic Rally Club is very grateful to the RMS and the relevant Minister for the scheme which allows the preservation of historic vehicles for road use without incurring the cost of full registration and insurance. The scheme works very well so long as it is not abused; it is not intended for day to day driving such as driving to work, going shopping, commuting to the railway station or driving the kids to school. The introduction of the 60 day log book trial allows members to enjoy 60 days use of the car for driving sake. The Classic Rally Club will not tolerate any abuse of the scheme by club members.

Types of Conditional Registration available to CRC members

- Historic Vehicle Registration H Plates (HVS)60 day log book which allows 60 days per year use plus club events This an accord between the RMS and individual car clubs
- An annual signature and club stamp required to ensure you are a financial member of the CRC RMS Form for HVS 1259
- Classic Vehicle Registration (CVS) similar to above but with modification allowed provided they are certified by and engineer's report. This is an accord between RMS and the CMC /ACMC An annual club RMS form for CVS 1835
- 4. Rally Registration for outright rally cars, note this is the only way cars with full roll cages can be registered in NSW.

When your renewal with the RMS falls due, they will send you a new Historic Vehicle Declaration form. You MUST have that form signed by the Club Plate Registrar, so allow enough time for this to be done before your registration falls due.

Procedure for renewing at the RMS:

- Get a pink slip. (The preferred option) You need to send a copy of the pink slip to me.
- A return stamped address envelope would be appreciated.
- Fill in the Historical Vehicle Declaration and mail to me. Email copies not permitted by RMS. Alternatively you can complete the writeable PDF on the RMS web site and that can be emailed to me but it needs to be posted back.
- Club Plates Registrar will complete Section 4. and sign
- Take or post your Conditional Registration renewal and pink slip to RMS or Services NSW for processing.

Don't forget that all movements of your car, other than those set out in the constitution, must be logged with the Club Plates Registrar or logged in your logbook if your car is on the 60 day scheme to ensure your CTP insurance is valid. Club Rules in addition to RMS Conditions

The scheme is designed for Classic Rally Club members who will be active in club events not just to provide cheap registration as per the overview of the scheme.

The club reserves the right to withdraw eligibility to those who do not participate in club activities.

Members should be financial members for 12 months prior to applying for club plates.

Members with club plates must comply with all RMS conditions and club rules and directions from club officials.

The club reserves the right to accept or reject any cars and to withdraw acceptance to the Historic and Classic Plate schemes.

In addition to the RMS costs the Classic Rally Club charges members on the HVP scheme \$25 per year and require them to sign a document annually requiring members to agree to the conditions of the scheme and to provide information on the insurance of their vehicles.
